

Lesson Guide: Robust Scripture Engagement

Lesson Goals

- Understand what robust Scripture Engagement means for this generation.
- Recognize three dimensions of biblical literacy: knowledge, competency, and influence.
- Identify ways to practically guide students toward biblical knowledge, competency, and influence.
- Recognize how Feed resources can help accomplish robust Scripture Engagement with students

Key Points

- Biblical knowledge is about helping students read and reiterate the biblical story.
- Biblical competency is about helping students interpret and reflect on the biblical story.
- Biblical influence is about helping students see how their whole life fits into God's story and allow the Bible to influence their lives as well as the lives around them.

Reflection and Application Questions

- Why might today's youth struggle with engaging the Bible? What might motivate them to engage the Bible more deeply and frequently?
- Think about the average student who is active in your ministry where might they stand in terms of their level of biblical knowledge, competency, and influence?
- Biblical knowledge is all about helping students know the who and what of Scripture. What practices or tools can you implement to pursue this outcome in your youth ministry? How might we begin by helping students get into the habit of reading Scripture on a regular basis?
- Biblical competency is about helping students know the why of Scripture, digging
 deeper into the context behind the Bible passages and how they relate to the larger
 biblical story. What practices or tools can you implement to pursue this outcome in
 your youth ministry? What questions do you typically ask yourself as you engage
 with Scripture? What resources have been most helpful for you that might equip
 your leaders?
- Biblical influence is all about equipping students with the how of Scripture, equipping them to love their neighbor as themselves and reflecting the character of Jesus. What practices or tools can you implement to pursue this outcome in your youth ministry? What specific actions could students take to live out the biblical story?
