




Dear friends, we are already God's children, but he has not yet shown us what we will be like when Christ appears. But we do know that we will be like him, for we will see him as he really is.




Describe the relationship between God's transformation of individuals and God's transformation of communities.

Do you find that social media helps you see yourself the way God made you to be? In what ways does it encourage you? In what ways does it distract or confuse you?



God is at work on both the individual and community level. How can belonging to a community of believers impact you as you grow in your individual identity?








Q. WHAT IS ADOPTION?


A: Adoption is when God makes us his sons and daughters through faith in Jesus Christ.
